Japanese classical dance, or *Nihon-buyo*, is distinguished by the forms and styles that have been developed over its 400-year history. Today it is practiced and performed by actors in the Kabuki Theatre, where it originated, as well as in traditional dance recitals throughout Japan.

IchiFuji-kai Dance Association teaches, performs and presents Japanese classical dance in the Soke Fujima style. Originating in 18th century Japan, and currently under the direction of Grandmaster Fujima Kanjuro VIII, this elegant style is acknowledged as one of the greatest among Japanese classical dance styles. IchiFuji-kai Dance Association, founded by Fujima Nishiki (Miyoko Watanabe) in 1961, has been contributing to cross-cultural understanding in the greater New York City area, and in 2011 will be celebrating its 50th anniversary.
